Use the sheet called 'Writing 110121 – character adjectives sheet' to record descriptions for the characters. Explain why we use them to end a sentence instead of a full stop to show when something shocking or exciting has happened or if someone has shouted, within speech. Use the sheet called '120121 Writing – Exclamation Marks' and write in the green book.	Objective: To use written (multiplication) methods. Friday	Set 1 words Choose a task from the following: (record in the green book) -Write each of the words in a sentence -Write each of the words, with vowels in one colour and consonants in another -Write each word twice, in CAPITAL LETTERS the first time and lower case letters the second time.	Objective: To answer questions about the text. Read the text again. Read the questions related to this text on the sheet (named '150121 Reading – Comprehension') Encourage them to keep going back to the text when answering questions. Please stick this in to the green book.	Objective: To begin to use inverted commas. Explain what an inverted comma is and why it's used (we know them as 'speech marks'). Look at page 31 of the copied text. Identify inverted commas (highlight or underline) Explain it is used to show that characters are speaking. Look at the last sentence where it says "Follow me." Discuss what the boy might say back. Then what might the mayor say? Use the sheet (named '150121 Writing – speech bubbles') to write the next part of the conversation.
